MISSION FOCUS SUNDAY

Released Time Christian Education (RTCE) is a program that has been bringing Bible education to public schools since 1916. With parental permission, students may attend a one-hour Bible study session once a week led by local volunteers. Currently, it is estimated that over 250,000 students participate throughout the country. Released Time has operated in the past year by inviting students to classes at local parks and through Zoom.
