## "A DIFFERENT KIND OF KING" Walking with the Savior #5 March 28, 2021

## Jesus is a Different Kind of King:

**1. Jesus comes as a humble King.** As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, <sup>30</sup> "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. <sup>31</sup> If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'" Luke 19:29-31

Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion!
Shout, Daughter Jerusalem!
See, your king comes to you,
righteous and victorious,
lowly and riding on a donkey,
on a colt, the foal of a donkey. Zechariah 9:9

The scepter will not depart from Judah,
nor the ruler's staff from between his feet,
until he to whom it belongs shall come
and the obedience of the nations shall be his.

11 He will tether his donkey to a vine,
his colt to the choicest branch;
he will wash his garments in wine,
his robes in the blood of grapes. Genesis 49:11-12

- **2. Jesus comes as a King who will bring freedom to his people.** Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. <sup>33</sup> As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" Luke 19:32-33
- **3. Jesus comes as the King of Peace.** As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it 42 and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes. Luke 19:41-42
- **4. Jesus comes as King over all of creation.** Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" <sup>40</sup> "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out." Luke 19:39-40

- 1. What was something you read in the weekly Scripture readings or heard in the sermon that made an impact on you? Explain.
- 2. What would a king expect from his people? What would the people expect from their king?
- 3. Read Luke 19:28-44. What do you see in this passage about the nature of Jesus (remembering that he is God in human flesh)?
- 4. In the sermon we talked about Jesus as a humble king. Where do you see evidence of this in the passage? Why do you think this is important for us?
- 5. Read Luke 19:41-42. What do you think Jesus means when he says that he came to bring "peace?"
- 6. In the sermon we talked about Jesus as the King over all of creation. What do you think this means for us as his disciples?
- 7. As you prepare yourself for "holy week," are there areas of your life you have not submitted to Jesus as your King? List them, confess, and ask someone to hold you accountable.
